The Council of the City of Ruidoso Downs met in regular session on September 14, 2009. Mayor Armstrong called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and asked Jim Burrow to lead the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was approval of the agenda. He said two items to be pulled were Item G and Item H under New Business until they can get further information on those two items.

Mayor Armstrong entertained a motion to approve the agenda with pulling Item G and Item H until they can get further information on those two items.

Councilor Williams moved to approve the agenda with pulling Item G and Item H until they can get further information on those two items. Seconded by Councilor Hood.

Armstrong said Carol has given the corrections to the council members but he wanted the public to be aware of these changes.

Mayor Armstrong entertained a motion to approve the Consent Agenda.

Councilor Hood moved to approve the Consent Agenda with those changes. Seconded by Councilor Williams.

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was to Unfinished Business.

There was no Unfinished Business.

OTHER BUSINESS (items are for discussion only-no action will be taken)

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was Other Business and no action would be taken.

Mayor Armstrong said the next item was Congratulation-Certified Municipal Officials Mayor Tom Armstrong, City Councilor Dean Holman and City Councilor Gary Williams.

Mayor Armstrong said this makes all of city council certified.

Carol Virden, City Clerk/Treasurer said we also need to recognize our previous certified municipal officials and that would be Councilor Olivo and Councilor Hood and at the time we had a full certified official board. She said she thought Ruidoso Downs was the first municipality that accomplished the certification of a full board. We need to congratulate the councilors and mayor because it is a time period of about a year and a half to accomplish this. There was a round of applause.

Mayor Armstrong said they appreciate the opportunity to go through this training and they will use this in the future to perform their duties.

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was the introduction of New Hired Employees for the City of Ruidoso Downs.

Cleatus Richards, Public Works Director introduced Dale Graham as the Project Manager and Raymond Montano was with the Street Department.

Chief Ortiz introduced Carolee Jones as their newest Police Officer and that she comes from the City of Portales and said that she would be a great asset to the department.

Councilor Holman said at the last council meeting he made some statements that lead to accusations that lead to questioning my integrity and that my statements were not accurate. They were without merit and fact. Just because I said these statements does not mean they are true. That's what was stated. I have documents in my possession that verify statements that I made are truthful, they were accurate and are accurate, and are factual. I'll provide this documentation on request only. If you ask for them I will provide them. I also ask that the City Clerk include these documents as far as the minutes of record of this council meeting.

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was Frank O'Dell spokesman for the W.A.T.S. UP Program. He said Frank O'Dell and Jimmy Sportsman were here this evening to speak about what they do.

Frank O'Dell said they are here to introduce the W.A.T.S. UP Program also known as "We Are the Sermon." We are a group of about twelve local churches in Ruidoso and Ruidoso Downs who are united and they did that to do community projects. At this time they have decided to concentrate on the Downs. They are utilizing a \$25,000 budget that's been given to them and several hundred volunteers. We plan on doing three projects on September 26th. We canvassed the Downs to kind of get an idea of what the people might need here in the Downs as far as cleaning up and homes that need fixing up. These projects will start at 8:00. We are going to clean, paint, and maybe refurbish maybe 20-25 homes in the Downs and at the racetrack there are about 3 shower facilities and maybe 400 groomsmen that use those facilities and they are pretty well worn. We're going to go outside and clean it up, paint it, and refurbish it. It will be painted inside and out and put in some new facilities for these groomsmen that take of the horses. Then we get to Riverside Park and I think it's a wonderful place for a park. We going to join with you in this effort and plan on furnishing about 16 of the tables and we've had about 120 cubic feet of base course donated and it's already down there as well as the donated tables. On that day they will put the base course down for the tables and put together the tables. We will also be putting the base course down for the walking/jobbing track. We think there is possibly more base course that is being donated. We'll use that on the tracks at the park

and then Cleatus will level it out with the roller. He said Cleatus and his staff has been real easy to work with and line us out on this project. One of the other things they're going to do is on the south bank at that park is there are a lot of dead trees and brush and weeds. He said he hopes to have about 20 teams to come in there with saws to cut it all out and drag them down to chip it up and maybe cut the trees up for firewood. Before we got down there they had already talked to PNM the power company and asked them to cut the dead wood out of the apple trees down there and there must be about twenty of them. It's in pretty bad shape. They came in there and cut it out with their bucket trucks. With a little more work you'll have some good trees down there again. At noon in the park the Catholic Church plans on feeding us, all the workers. All the workers at the track, all the workers in the Downs and the ones working in the park. I thought that was super for them to do that. Saturday afternoon at 5:30 we'll all meet at the grand stands at the racetrack. The racetrack has donated their venue to us for nothing. At 5:30 we're going to plan on feeding 1500 to 2000 people, free meal, anyone who wants to come. We've had flyers out all over town about this. From 7:00 to 9:00 we're going to have music for two hours. Jimmy Sportsman said it's the best sound system in town, it will be first rate and there will be musicians from El Paso. He said the meal will be from 5:30 to 7:30 and it will be a full barbeque meal. We're asking people to come for an evening of entertainment. Frank O'Dell said on Sunday morning at 11:00 they are going to have a community worship service at the same place. He said he just wanted to say that there has been a lot of material and time donated by the local people. Some of the tables need a little bit of work done on them but it will get done. The people that hauled that base course did a good job too. He said everyone they've asked to do something has said yes they will do it. That day they plan on having about ten pieces of equipment down there helping us, probably about five or six Bobcats to help with lifting the tables and putting them together and dragging the trees to the dumpsters or whatever. Jimmy Sportsman said thank you for the opportunity to do this. We realize it is a team effort. He said they have done this for the Village of Ruidoso and have put in a park at Alto Lake with a walking track and picnic tables. This time around they wanted to make sure that Ruidoso Downs was blessed but we couldn't do that without your support and we'd love to see you there with your community. Frank O'Dell said one of the things we want to also do is to get the local churches working together.

Councilor Holman said this is the first time I've seen Frank O'Dell since 1947 or 1948. He said recently he called again to explain this program. Frank had told him they had done this work at Alto Lake so he and the mayor went out to check this and what kind of work they did. Councilor Holman said they do quality work and the trail and the concrete benches, Ruidoso hit the jackpot with that. He said we are so glad that you are coming to the Downs.

Mayor Armstrong said he would like to thank them and that he was looking forward to this and thought it was a very good idea and can't imagine getting all of these people together and what they are going to do for Ruidoso Downs.

Mayor Armstrong said there was one other item, which was Lincoln County Recycling Advisory Committee Certificate of Award Honoring, the City of Ruidoso Downs for being Conscientious About Recycling. It says that we are helping with keeping things cleaned up and are using recycling everyday.

Terri Mosley, Finance Director said she would like to report that they received a reimbursement from the State on a 2005 grant. She said we got \$320,463.99. This is from a 2005 grant that is now closed out and was from water well and chlorination facility. Mayor Armstrong said that was for the Riverside Well.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was Consider Approving Special Dispenser Permit Application-Opening of The Cope Learning Center-October 16, 2009-HMAW.

Mayor Armstrong entertained a motion to approve the Special Dispenser Permit Application for the opening of The Cope Learning Center on October 16, 2009 at the Hubbard Museum of the American West.

Councilor Williams moved to approve the Special Dispenser Permit Application for the opening of The Cope Learning Center on October 16, 2009 at the Hubbard Museum of the American West. Seconded by Councilor Hood.

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was to Consider Approval of Special Dispenser Permit Application-Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally-September 17 through 29, 2009.

Mayor Armstrong entertained a motion to approve the Special Dispenser Permit Application for the Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally for September 17 through 29, 2009.

Councilor Olivo moved to approve the Special Dispenser Permit Application for the Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally for September 17 through 29, 2009. Seconded by Councilor Williams.

Roll call votes: Councilor Hood, Aye; Councilor Williams, Aye; Councilor Holman, Aye; Councilor Olivo, Aye. Motion carried.

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was to Consider Approving Termination of Lease Agreement with Bonnie Richardson for LCT Office at 271 Highway 70.

Mickie Compton said the lease with Bonnie Richardson is up shortly and we have to make a move. We are not in compliance currently in that location with the federal compliance issues with the 5311 grant. The 5311 grant states that to be in compliance we have to have a secured lot for the federally funded vehicles and in addition to three new vehicles that we should be taking delivery of within the next three weeks. In addition to that the office location has to be able to pass a safety

inspection and be up to code with electricity and things of that nature and the current location does not provide for those safety issues. She said they have found another location that would be in compliance and therefore the need to terminate the lease with Bonnie Richardson is necessary.

Mayor Armstrong asked if Bonnie Richardson was aware of this?

Mickie Compton said she has not spoken with her because she wanted to make sure it was approved in council first. Mickie said Bonnie is aware of the issues with parking and the electrical.

Mayor Armstrong entertained a motion for approval of the termination of the lease agreement with Bonnie Richardson for LCT office at 271 Highway 70.

Councilor Williams moved to approve the termination of the lease agreement with Bonnie Richardson for LCT office at 271 Highway 70. Seconded by Councilor Olivo.

Councilor Williams said the agreement went until November and asked when Mickie was going to discuss moving out with Bonnie Richardson?

Mickie Compton said the current lease states that you have to give at least a 30-day notice. She said she would like to take residency at the new location by November 1st.

Mayor Armstrong asked if we were paying for two places?

Mickie Compton said no.

Zach Cook asked if we were staying through the end of this lease?

Mickie Compton said we could stay through the end of the lease term, which would be November 10th, and then we just wouldn't renew it. The sooner we get into the new location the better for compliance reasons. The State has given me time to make those arrangements.

Zach Cook said the current lease doesn't end until November 10th and the new lease begins October 1st. He said he was concerned about backing out of a lease that hasn't ended yet.

Mickie Compton said if it was okay with Mrs. Reynolds they could possibly begin the new lease on November 1st.

Zach Cook said or November 11th?

Councilor Williams asked why there wasn't discussion with Bonnie Richardson before this so we could get an understanding before approving this?

Mickie Compton said November 10th would be ample time to give Bonnie Richardson a 30-day notice. She said Bonnie was aware of the electrical code and compliance issues and there is no way that building could be brought to those standards without fencing the entire lot and that expense would be considerable.

Councilor Williams said with that in mind she does need to have that discussion first before we approve this so we need to consider postponing this until the next council meeting for discussion and approval after she's had the discussion with Bonnie and the 30-day notice can be identified.

Mickie Compton said she could get with Bonnie and do the 30-day notice. That would eliminate the termination of the lease. If the lease just ran out and just not renew it and but renew the new lease.

Zach Cook, City Attorney said ideally Bonnie might be willing to let us out of the lease right now because there are some problems with compliance but we just need to have that conversation with her. He said tabling right now would be a good idea until somebody has had that conversation with her.

Councilor Williams moved to amend his main motion from the termination of the lease agreement with Bonnie Richardson for LCT office at 271 Highway 70 until the next council meeting or an agreement is reached between Mickie Compton and Bonnie Richardson for the 30-day termination of the lease agreement. Seconded by Councilor Hood.

Roll call votes: Councilor Hood, Aye; Councilor Williams, Aye; Councilor Holman, Aye; Councilor Olivo, Aye. Motion carried.

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was Consider approval to Implement New Lease with Laura Reynolds Trust at 2961 Sudderth Drive, Ruidoso, NM.

Mayor Armstrong asked Laura Reynolds if she understood what we did here?

Laura Reynolds said she understood the termination dates and complexity of this issue and was able to hold out for a couple of weeks and it seems to the amount of time necessary.

Councilor Williams thanked her for her patience and that they were looking forward to this agreement with the LCT in the near future.

Councilor Williams moved to postpone until the termination of the lease with Bonnie Richardson was approved and to postpone implementation of new lease with Laura Reynolds Trust at 2961 Sudderth Dr., Ruidoso, NM. Seconded by Councilor Hood.

Roll call votes: Councilor Hood, Aye; Councilor Williams, Aye; Councilor Holman, Aye; Councilor Olivo, Aye. Motion carried.

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was Consider Approving Signature of Special Section 5333 B Warranty.

Mickie Compton said on the last agenda this item was tabled so that the city attorney could brief it and get more information.

Zach Cook, City Attorney said this was just a new thing to him and it was basically just to see if we were in compliance since we were receiving federal funds and he said he didn't see any issue with it.

Councilor Williams moved to approve Signature of Special Section 5333 B Warranty. Seconded by Councilor Olivo.

Roll call votes: Councilor Hood, Aye; Councilor Williams, Aye; Councilor Holman, Aye; Councilor Olivo, Aye. Motion carried.

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was Consider Approving Memorandum of Agreement between the City of Ruidoso Downs and New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT) for Funding Assistance for Section 5311 FY 2010-2011.

Mickie Compton said the date for the 5311 should read FY 2009-2010. It's for the MOA for the fiscal year beginning October 1. She said we just submitted the application for FY 2010-2011. This is for the funds we've already received approval of.

Councilor Holman asked if this was for the funds that have already been approved?

Mickie Compton said yes, for funds approved by the Department of Transportation and the Federal Transit Administration. These are the funds with match money for this fiscal year. The fiscal year begins October 1, 2009 and ends September 30, 2010.

Councilor Holman said this is in the amount of \$28,307.92?

Mickie Compton said that is the correct amount for the equal match however the Downs did not approve the \$28,307.92. They approved the \$25,000.00.

Councilor Holman said so that is what you are asking for and not what is listed here?

Mickie Compton said this is the total amount that was approved by the state divided equally by three equal entities would come to \$28,307.92 of which the Village and the County approved. The Downs only approved \$25,000.00. She said she was not sure if it was a formal understanding that if they needed the extra funds if it would be available or not. As far as the budget goes it shows \$25,000.00 match for the Downs.

Councilor Holman asked if that was what they were asking for?

Mickie Compton said yes.

Carol Virden, City Clerk/Treasurer said to Mickie if she would recall the letter received from the Lincoln County Managers desk that whatever the City of Ruidoso Downs paid, whichever was less or more, that they would also contribute to that. So, if we issue you a check for \$25,000.00 that is all you will get from the county, you do understand that?

Mickie Compton said it was also understood that they would agree with the Village's commitment as well. She said if they agree with \$25,000.00 then we'll have to do budget cuts.

Carol Virden, City Clerk/Treasurer said they did budget the \$28 thousand but the letter said if we would match that they too but if we did it for less they would issue a check for the same amount that we did.

Mickie Compton said she had a County Commissioners meeting tomorrow and could verify the actual amount. She said she does understand the \$25,000.00 because of the way the letter was worded. She said she would find out from the county if they want to drop down to the \$25,000.00 or if they intend to do the \$28. She said regardless in order to continue operations they do need to get the MOA signed. The MOA will state for the total amount whether we use it or not. The MOA was awarded at \$97,782.00 and the \$137,734.00 for a total of \$228,517.22. That's what we were awarded by DOT & FTA and that's what the MOA will read regardless of the amount of match. We will have to adjust our budget by the match amount.

Mickie Compton said she was unaware of Item G and Item H being removed from the agenda. She said she didn't know when the best time was for her to ask the reason for that because these were time sensitive items. These items have to be taken care of prior to October 1st.

Mayor Armstrong said they were looking into that and getting more information.

Mickie Compton said she was not notified.

Mayor Armstrong said they would get with her as soon as they can.

Mickie Compton asked if they would have this information prior to October 1st?

Mayor Armstrong said yes they would.

Carol Virden, City Clerk/Treasurer said they would be on the agenda for the next council meeting.

Mayor Armstrong stated next item on the agenda was Consider Approving Contract Amendment No. 5 Between the Village of Ruidoso and Molzen Corbin & Associates for Engineering and Professional Services to Provide for Operations, Startup, and Training Assistance for Phase 1A of the Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant to Include Video Tape Preparation.

Carol Virden, City Clerk/Treasurer said this item was at the request of the JUB meeting that was held 9th and it was asked that this issue go back to both municipalities for approval to spend not more than \$20,000 for the operations, startup, training assistance, and the video taping services for Phase 1A Sludge Handling and also Violent Disinfections facility improvement projects. She said she was here to ask the council under the recommendation of the JUB for approval of this to not further delay the process.

Councilor Williams moved to approve the contract amendment No. 5 between the Village of Ruidoso and Molzen Corbin & Associates for engineering and profession services to provide for operations, startup, and training assistance for Phase 1A of the Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant to include video tape preparation. Seconded by Councilor Olivo.

Mayor Armstrong entertained a motion to approve awarding Bid No. 10-001 US 70 Pedestrian Access (Bid Lot 1) TPE-070-4 (1) 261, CN L2057 and West Drive Improvements (Bid Lot 2) SP-08- (923), CN 88093 and SP-2-09 (976) CN HW2M20026.

Councilor Williams moved to approve awarding Bid No. 10-001 US 70 Pedestrian Access (Bid Lot 1) TPE-070-4 (1) 261, CN L2057 and West Drive Improvements (Bid Lot 2) SP-08- (923), CN 88093 and SP-2-09 (976) CN HW2M20026. Seconded by Councilor Olivo.

Cleatus Richards, Public Works Director said the West Drive project will start between Harris and Burke tying into the existing curbing and gutter phasing just north of Burke and will extend down to Allison Drive. It will involve a 20-foot paving section back-to-back with curb and gutter with lay down flat curb section and asphalt paving for the full length. On Highway 70, that's approximately 2900 linear feet of sidewalk, curb, and gutter that will be constructed. That project will run from Wal-Mart to about where the Cowboy's Riding Stable sign is on the south side. It's about 500 feet beyond the entrance to the racetrack area from the stable area. That will leave about 4/10th of a mile yet to be completed and as you know we have applied for stimulus money hopefully for the remainder of that project. The governor said he will know in about a week whether we will be getting those funds. The whole project has been designed. We won't be able to

award to the same contractor. It's a fairly large amount to finish up so we would have to bid out as a second project.

Chief Ortiz said this recommendation is to fill a full-time Communications Dispatch Operator position that was vacated. He said Dixie Tillman was recommended and she comes from Texas of the Texas Correctional System and has experience with dispatching and communications.

Councilor Olivo moved to approve Personnel Recommendation-Position-FT CDO-Ruidoso Downs Police Department. Seconded by Councilor Williams

Councilor Holman moved to confirm Mayor Armstrong's action of appointment of Harold Oakes to Economic Development Board. Seconded by Councilor Williams.

Councilor Holman said he would like to commend the mayor on that selection of Harold Oakes to the Economic Development Board and that he made an excellent choice.

Mayor Armstrong said actually Mr. Oakes came to him and said he thought he could help so the mayor told him he could use him.
